Federal Workforce Investment Act Youth Program Grant Applications Available Online

JUNEAU, Alaska—The Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development is accepting grant proposals that will help disadvantaged youth develop the skills they need to succeed in Alaska's workforce.

"The Workforce Investment Act-Youth program supports a comprehensive approach to provide academic and occupational opportunities to eligible participants," said Corine Geldhof, director of Business Partnerships.
