Safety training to be held in Anchorage
Ten-hour General Industry course for employees and employers

ANCHORAGE, Alaska— The Alaska Occupational Safety and Health consultation and training section will sponsor an Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) 10-hour General Industry course in Anchorage on March 14 and 15. The training will educate employees and employers on the recognition, avoidance, abatement, and prevention of safety and health hazards in the workplace. The course provides information regarding workers' rights and employer responsibilities, and is most suitable for entry-level workers. Upon successful completion, students will be mailed an OSHA 10-hour card.
