## Good day VPP Safety Coordinators!

Hello VPP participants and Happy New Year!!! I hope everyone had a wonderful, enjoyable, and safe holiday season. It's that time of the year again for Annual Self-Evaluations (ASE). Reports are due to AKOSH by COB Monday, January 31, 2022. AKOSH must review and submit to the Region no later than February 15, 2022. If an extension is required, you must submit the request in writing (via email) stating (1) the reason why the extension is needed and (2) length of extension you are requesting. If this extension reaches and/or exceeds 45 days from the due date, your site may be asked to withdraw from the VPP Program.
